Secret Christian in Somalia

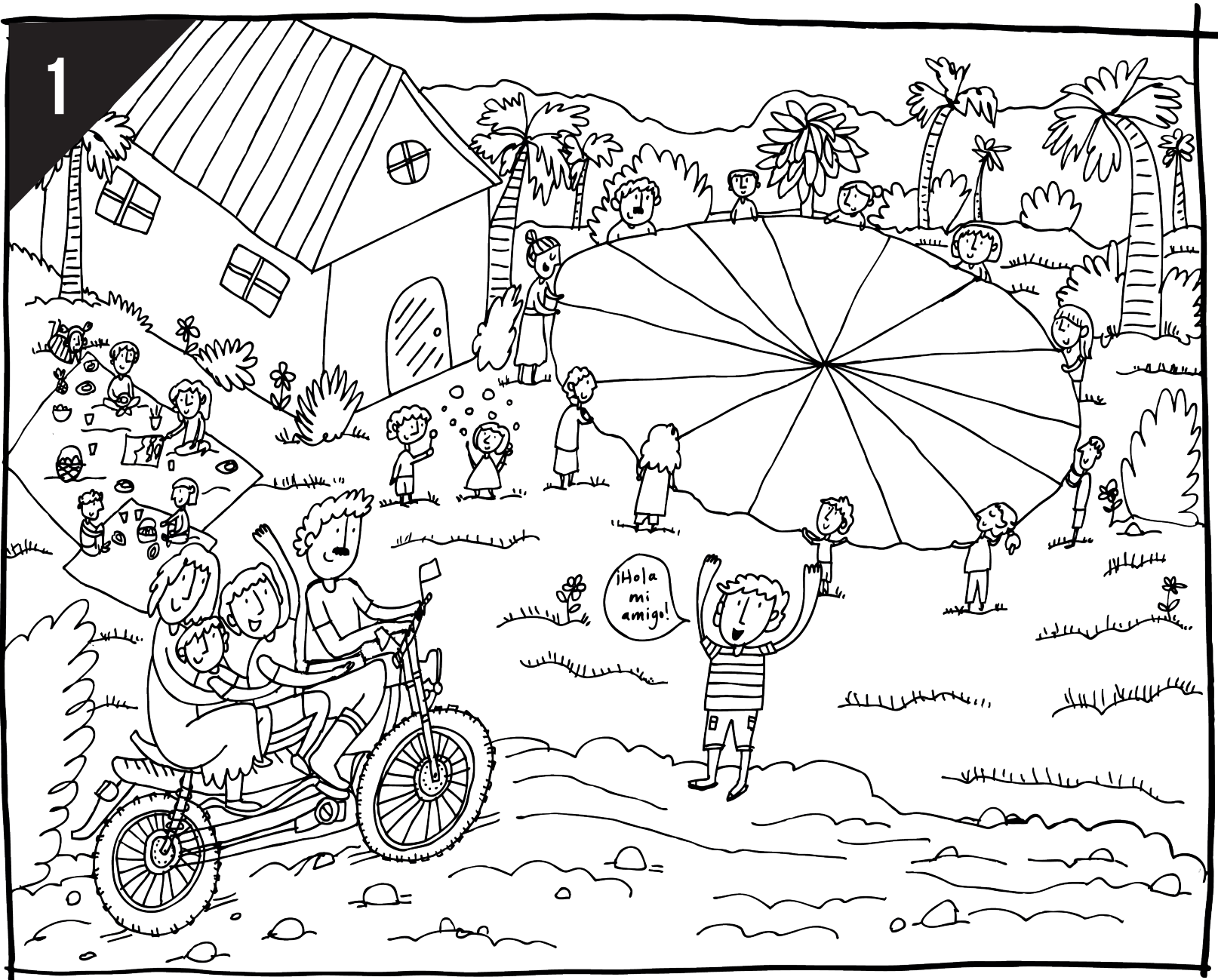
"We are experiencing horrible things here every day. It appears that I live in hell on earth. I wish I could just stand inside a church and cry out in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ."

It seems a simple wish, to stand in a church. But it is completely impossible for this believer in Somalia, where even being suspected of being a Christian can lead to instant execution.

The militant Islamist group al-Shabaab has stated publicly that it 'wants Somalia free of all Christians', and is able to persecute believers with impunity as the state is basically lawless. These militants have intensified their hunt for Christian leaders this year.

Christians must keep their faith completely secret. Even a positive response to a Christian post on social media can have serious consequences. They meet in small underground groups constantly changing locations to avoid monitoring by al-Shabaab militants or community leaders. Nevertheless, people are becoming Christians - through radio programmes broadcast by partners of Open Doors.

Food for thought: How can we show solidarity with the persecuted church?
